It Shall be unlawful for any owner of a dog in the Town of Long Lake to permit or allow such dog to:

- A.** Run at large, unless the dog is restrained by an adequate leash or unless it is accompanied by its owner or a responsible person and under the full control of such owner or person. For the purpose of this Section and Article 7 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Law, a dog or dogs hunting in company of a hunter or hunters shall be considered as accompanied by its owner.
- B.** Engage in habitual loud howling, barking, crying or whining or to conduct itself in such a manner as to habitually annoy any person other than the owner or harbinger of the dog.
- C.** Cause damage or destruction to public or private property, defecate, urinate or otherwise commit a nuisance upon the property of other than the owner or harbinger of the dog.
- D.** Bite, chase, jump upon or otherwise harass any person in such a manner as to cause intimidation or to put such person in reasonable apprehension of bodily harm or injury.
- E.** Habitually chase, leap upon or otherwise harass bicycles, other non-motorized means of transportation or motorized vehicle.
- F.** Kill or injure any dog, cat, or other household pet.
- G.** Be unlicensed when over four months of age.
- H.** Not have a current and valid Town of Long Lake Identification tag on its collar while at large, whether or not restrained by an adequate leash.
- I.** If female, when in heat, be off the owner's premises unrestrained or left outside unattended. Any owner not adhering to this rule will be subject to having the Dog Control Officer Seize the dog and move it to a safe place of confinement.
- J.** The Dog Control Officer of the Town of Long Lake shall administer and enforce the provisions of this article and for that purpose shall have authority to issue appearance tickets, and to seize dogs, either on or off the owner's premises, if witnessed to be in violation of this article.

HOW TO LICENSE YOUR DOG

New York State Law & Town of Long Lake Local Law #2 of 2011 require every dog residing in the Town of Long Lake and over the age of four months to be licensed.

To apply for a dog license, owners must bring the following to the Long Lake Town Clerk's Office:

1. Current Rabies Certificate

vaccination signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine.

2. Spay or neutered certificate,

If applicable, (if the rabies certificate indicates that your dog is altered, the office will accept that in lieu of a spay/neutered certificate.

3. License Fee

Spay/neutered:

\$10.00

Un-spayed/ Un-neutered:

\$20.00

Check made out to:

Long Lake Town Clerk

Or cash are acceptable forms of payment.

After the application and appropriate certificate are filed and the license fee has been paid, the license will be validated for one year. Each dog is assigned a permanent official identification (ID) number and issued a metal ID tag which is to be attached to the dog's collar. Annual license renewal reminders will be mailed from the office of the Town Clerk.

Upon submission of proper documentation, there shall be no fee charged for the license issued for any detective dog, guide dog, hearing dog, police working dog, service dog, therapy dog, war dog or working search dog.
