SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Expenditure and Revenue Reports were in the Board's packets for review.

BESS- National Grid sent the Town a press release that they and REV have decided not to put the battery energy storage system in the middle of the hamlet in Raquette Lake. Supervisor Arsenault congratulated all who were so passionate about their concerns of preventing this project. He thanked the Board and office staff for all the hard work they have done. The Town will continue to fine tune the Town's current BESS Law and to change the Comprehensive Plan to account for the community's concerns.

VanVleet- Summary of Well Evaluation and Redevelopment Activities for Bissell Pit from Jamie Gironda of Hanon VanVleet were in the Board's packets. VanVleet was able to successfully rehabilitate the wells at Bissell pit in 2023, resulting in increased capacity from both wells. Recommendations of parameters that the Water Department should track at Bissell Pit to assist in determining their function in the future. An additional pump house was discussed to make the wells more effective; this will be discussed with CHA during the water system needs assessment.

AWI Report- The Adirondack Watershed Institute Stewardship Program report for 2023 in Long Lake was included in the Board's packets. The AWI runs the stewards at the State Boat Launch on Dock Road, as well as the Boat Wash Station at the Municipal Parking Lot. The report included that 1577 boats were inspected at the Boat Launch, and 7 Aquatic Invasive Species were found, and 33 boats were washed at the Boat Wash Station with no instances of AIS.

DANC- Matt Newby has been in contact with the Development Authority of the North Country (DANC), to come to terms with their assistance in managing the Jennings Park Pond Causeway Rebuild Project. The Town Attorney will review and hoping to have a proposed agreement in front of the Board by next month's meeting.

Retirement- Cindy Black has given her Notice of Retirement, effective date will be January 31st, 2025.

RESOLUTION 16 OF 2024 RESOLUTION TO SIGN ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENTS WITH BONADIO & CO., LLP TO PROVIDE OUTSOURCED ACCOUNTING SERVICES FOR 2024

WHEREAS, Bonadio & Co., LLP. has performed outsourced accounting services for the Town of Long Lake since January of 2023, in addition to preparing the Annual Update Document and hosting accounting software for the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor has recommended signing a new agreement with Bonadio for 2024, for which Bonadio has presented the Town Supervisor with a proposed engagement agreement for 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Town is facing large public works capital project that will require specialized accounting counseling and guidance and for which Bonadio had provided an additional proposed engagement for as-needed specialty accounting guidance;

Now, Therefore, be it resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Long Lake,

1. Authorizes and directs Clay J. Arsenault, as Town Supervisor of the Town of Long Lake, or such person's successor in office to sign an engagement agreement for fiscal year 2024 with Bonadio & Co., LLP. To provide the Town, in an amount not to exceed \$4,275 per

- month for Outsource Accounting Services and actual monthly software fees, and \$5,500 annually for Annual Update Document (AUD) or Annual Financial Report (AFR) reporting. Changes to this scope of engagement and associated changes in fees must be approved by the Town Board; and
- 2. Authorizes and directs Clay J. Arsenault, as Town Supervisor of the Town of Long Lake, or such person's successor on office to sign an engagement agreement for fiscal year 2024 with Bonadio & Co., LLP. To provide the Town with Consulting services related to capital projects and other assistance as provided. Fees will be based upon the amount of time required at the standard billing rates for Bonadio & Co., LLP. Plus out-of-pocket expenses. These services are on an as needed basis, and the Scope of Work will be determined for each instance. Changes to this scope of engagement and associated changes in fees must be approved by the Town Board; and
- 3. That a copy of both the proposed Engagement Agreement for Outsourced Accounting Services and the separate Engagement Agreement for Consulting Services referenced in this resolution be forever attached to a certified copy of this resolution and held by the Town Clerk in their records.
